Recent Events

<u>CTBT: Science and Technology 2019 Conference</u> (SnT2019), June 24-28, Vienna (Austria)

More than 1,100 scientists, technologists, policymakers, diplomats, academics, students, journalists and others from nearly 100 countries thronged Vienna's historic Hofburg Palace to exchange views and expertise to help achieve a world free of nuclear explosions.

CYG was actively engaged in conference activities:
The Forum on Global Citizenship and Youth Inclusion (Speakers from the CYG: Sahil Shah and Sylvia Mishra)
Networking and Working group session featuring GEM and CYG members - 6 groups consisting of CYG and GEM members were tasked to discuss one respective question and come up with concrete bullet-pointed recommendations.

- Panel discussion: CTBTO Youth Group - Agents of Change for Progress of CTBT entry into force (Speaker from the CYG: Marzhan Nurzhan)
- CTBT Innovation challenge presentation and discussion: CTBTO and the 2030 United Nations agenda for sustainable development: strengthening the link (Winners of the CTBTO Youth Group CTBT Innovation Challenge presented their original ideas linking the CTBT to achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals)
- European Union CTBTO Cooperation: multilateralism at work (Speaker from the CYG: Samuel Luyckx)
- CYG members from the Newsroom covered conference sessions, conducted interviews and took pictures for the Newsroom project SnTimes.

10th anniversary of Pelindaba Treaty, July 15

The African Nuclear-Weapon-Free-Zone (ANWFZ) Treaty — the Treaty of Pelindaba — was signed in Cairo on 11 April 1996 and entered into force on 15 July 2009. The ultimate objective of the Pelindaba Treaty is to strengthen international peace, to further regional security in Africa and to reinforce the NPT regime.

<u>Nelson Mandela International Day</u>, July 18

Nelson Mandela strongly supported the cause of banning nuclear tests. South Africa's ratification of the CTBT in 1999 holds his signature as he urged "all other countries to give their prompt support".

- * <u>Hiroshima ICAN Academy on Nuclear Weapons and Global Security 2019</u>, July 31 August 8, Hiroshima (Japan). Hiroshima Prefecture and International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN), the 2017 Nobel Peace Prize Award-winning organization, jointly launch the "Hiroshima-ICAN Academy on Nuclear Weapons and Global Security" to nurture future leaders who could make concrete contributions towards realizing a peaceful world.
- * <u>Vienna International Model United Nations, 25th Anniversary Conference</u>, <u>August 4-8</u>, UN, Vienna (Austria). A Model United Nations (MUN) is a meeting where students authentically simulate negotiations of specific committees and organs of the United Nations.
- * World Youth Summit for Peace 2019 (WYSP), August 8-12, Dubai (UAE). In this Summit more than 80 World Leaders (Former and Present Presidents, Prime Ministers, Ministers, Members of Parliaments and Diplomats), 200 Business & Entrepreneurs leaders, world rewound Artists, Singers, Models, along with 5000 delegates will comes from over 196 countries, more than 20000 local Youth will also Participate to share the ideas and their experiences with each other. The Summit covers 6 session themes: SDG 2030 Leadership, Education, Climate change,



Women&Gender equality, Interfaith and Society, Human Rights and Peace.



*August 31 Application deadline for the 3rd International Youth Summit Lahore, December 2-8, Lahore (Pakistan). Summit will aim to highlight how inclusive and sustainable economic growth is crucial in achieving the 2030 Agenda, to apperceive the systematic use of scientific and technical knowledge to meet specific objectives or requirements, leading to a universal call for action to end poverty, protect the planet, and ensure that all people enjoy peace and prosperity.

opportunity to follow the counting and learn what benefits the money spent to modernize nuclear arsenals could bring if re-directed to economic, social and environmental needs.
