Seventy-five years ago – on 16 July, 1945 – the world's first nuclear explosion seared the desert of New Mexico.The U.S. 'Trinity' test, carried out at the Alamogordo Test Range, opened the way to the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki less than a month later.

CYG Faces - expanding networks

"I joined CYG in the Spring of 2018 after becoming interested in international organizations and nuclear-related issues during my undergraduate studies. During my graduate studies at the Moscow State Institute of International Relations (MGIMO) in the Fall of 2018, I attended a lecture on the CTBTO by CYG member Asya Shavrova. Asya's lecture rekindled my interest in CYG, which led me to refound a CYG Chapter at the Middlebury Institute of International Studies (MIIS) in Monterey, California with Tom Hickey. Tom and I not only participated in CYG activities at the 2019 Carnegie International Nuclear Policy Conference, we also hosted documentary film screenings and lectures on nuclear testing featuring Jean Du Preez, the former head of the CTBTO External Relations Division, and two



of our more accomplished CYG colleagues, Anne Pellegrino and Grace Liu. The highlight of my CYG experience was organizing a site visit to the Nevada former Nevada Nuclear Test Site for 30 MIIS students. There, we not only learned about the history of US nuclear testing, but also about nuclear testing verification research that the Department of Energy (DoE) had recently conducted in Nevada and presented to the 2019 CTBT Science and Technology Conference. One official noted that our group received essentially the same tour that Executive Secretary Lassina Zerbo had received years earlier. Most recently, I served at the Holy See Mission to the UN, where I followed nuclear-related meetings. There, I had the pleasure of working alongside another CTBTO alumnus, Dr. Pierce Corden, who previously led the organization's Division of Administration. Working with CYG has been the highlight of my graduate studies, and I hope to have the opportunity to collaborate further with CYG and CTBTO colleagues in raising public awareness regarding the consequences of nuclear testing and promoting CTBT entry into force." - **JEREMY FAUST (USA)**
