Virtual Tabletop Exercise

On October 22, CYG hosted a Virtual Tabletop Exercise which allowed participants to engage in mock negotiations in a simulated Executive Council vote on an OSI request. In a fictional scenario, CYG members were guided through the process by CTBTO experts.
